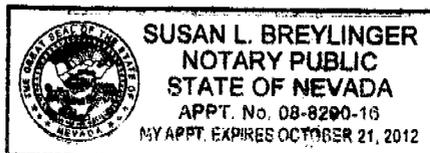

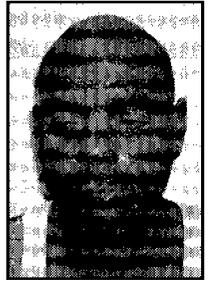

History of the Comstock

Dayton's Carson & Colorado RR Depot restoration efforts go on

On Saturday, April 30 and Sunday, May 1, the second annual jamboree was held in Dayton to raise funds for the restoration of the historic depot of the Carson and Colorado Railroad.

The goal of this effort is to restore the Dayton Depot to its original 1881 appearance and create a Visitor's Center with displays of C&C RR artifacts and exhibits. During the heyday of the mining boom, Dayton was considered the "Gateway to the Comstock."

The narrow gauge Carson & Colorado Railroad connected with the Virginia & Truckee at Moundhouse in 1881. The original depot has been relocated to the northwest corner of U.S. 50 and Main Street due to realignment of U.S. 50.

This building has been used as a private residence since its relocation, but is now owned by Lyon County with a stewardship agreement with the Historical Society of Dayton Valley. Once the restoration project is completed, it will be the only restored Carson & Colorado depot left in

Nevada.

It was the first depot constructed on the C&C Railroad and all the others were patterned after it. Application has been made for Federal Transportation Enhancement funding to help complete the restoration. The annual jamborees are being held to generate public awareness and interest in the project and to help raise much needed funds.

Beginning in 1881, the railroad operated from Moundhouse and continued through Dayton, Churchill, Wabuska, Hawthorne, Mina, Candelaria and terminated

at Keeler, California, on the shores of Owens Lake. It was very useful in bringing ores from mining districts in the southern desert regions to the mills in the Dayton area.

In an agreement with the Indian tribes on the Walker Lake reservation, Indians were allowed to ride the rails free of charge, usually riding on top of the freight cars as they traveled through the desert.

When repairs were needed on the narrow gauge C&C, the rolling stock was sent to the V&T Shops in Carson City. Workmen in the V&T shops were not accustomed to working on the smaller equipment and nicknamed the Carson and Colorado the "Slim Princess." The railroad was owned and operated by the same people who ran the V&T including Darius Ogden Mills and Henry Yerington. Mills often commented that the C&C was built "300 miles too long or 300 years too soon." As mining activity declined around the turn of the century, the struggling railroad was sold for over two million dollars to the Southern Pacific Co.

The new owners made a wise investment choice, since just after the sale

was made, the rich mining districts in Tonopah and Goldfield were discovered. This brought a resurgence in activity on the line and the railroad was converted to a standard gauge.

A connection was made to the Southern Pacific line near Hazen and the activity on the V&T portion decreased dramatically. The original intent was to build the railroad all the way to the Colorado River near Las Vegas. This obviously never happened but the name Colorado stuck with the railroad throughout its existence.

My own family used the C&C Railroad during the 1890-1910 time span to transport produce and livestock from their ranch in Dayton to the Comstock and other places along the route of the C&C.

STOREY COUNTY BUDGET MESSAGE

The following Tentative Budget for Storey County is for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011 and ending June 30, 2012.

The Storey County Comptroller and Finance Personnel are currently working with the appointed Independent Auditor's to refine and correct some revenue account numbers to the required classifications by the Dept of Taxation. Currently certain revenue items are listed in the General Fund by the Auditor under miscellaneous and should be in other categories. The total revenue in the Budget will match the total listed in the audit report, but the categories will not.

The Independent Auditor's Report for 2009-10 is missing a capital lease for the Sheriff Vehicles. The interest and principle payment are listed in the Audit under the service and supply category in the General Fund, under the Sheriff's Department in Public Safety. The County Comptroller has directed the Financial Personnel to list this item as a Debt Service Payment and list the item on the C-1 report.

Fiscal challenges will continue into and beyond the next budget year. Declining property values will most certainly continue to place significant stress on our primary revenue source...ad valorem property taxes. Even with the decline in ad valorem the Storey County Commissioners are adamant that the County portion of our overall tax rate this year remains the same 2.3960.

Discussion with all three of our Collective Bargaining Associations has been initiated to determine possible contract extensions and terms. For the purpose of developing this initial budget, all were advised that we have factored in the following provisions:

- Minimal COLA designed to offset PERS increase impact.
- Restoration of step increases where applicable.
- Elimination of a \$200/month dependent waiver incentive.
- Reinstatement of one floating holiday.
- 50/50 cost sharing of PERS increase (statutory mandate).

We also have a significant ongoing concern as to Legislative actions that might occur to resolve State fiscal problems at the expense of Local Governments. In the General Fund \$275,000 is currently being reserved in the ending fund balance for Legislative impacts most likely to occur from cost/service shifts as outlined in the Governor's budget proposal.

A significant difference this year is the method we approach for our TRI Payback reserves. We believe the best approach is to first recognize all revenue and then treat TRI cost provisions as an expense via transfer to the dedicated fund. The net effect on the General, Fire, Forestry, Equipment Acquisition and Jail funds will appear as an increase in revenues but is offset by the transfer provision. Each of these same funds will also appear to have an equal offsetting increase in expenses, with the General Fund portion appearing in the Administrative budget.

Our (NDF) Fire District Fund (#040), it is important to note that Storey County is in discussion with officials from the Nevada Division of Forestry and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources that might possibly lead to the County taking over responsibility for wild land fire protection (NRS 473) effective January 1, 2012. Nothing has been conclusively decided but the mid-year timing is crucial since we do not want to risk a change over in the middle of a fire season. If this were to happen, we would still stay within the forecasted budget. Only the service provider would change from the Nevada Division of Forestry to Storey County.

For Indigent Medical Fund the tax rate levied for this year is .0100 because of the unencumbered balance on March 31, 2011 in the amount of \$732,975, which is governed by NRS 428.285(2). The Commissioners have applied the remaining tax rate of .0200 to the General Fund in case the State requests funds that are not available in the Indigent Medical Fund.

Pursuant to NRS 428.295(2), Indigent Care is currently listed in the General Fund Administrative Department and is listed in the Service and Supplies category. In 2010-11 Budget the amount of \$8,360 was allocated and we have increased this amount by 4.5%. Therefore, the amount allocated for the 2011-12 budget is \$ 8,736.

A Special Revenue Park Fund was created this year having previously been part of the General Fund list in the Park/Pool Department. Revenues represent collection of a \$250 per residential building permits per NRS Chapter 278. The revenues and expenses in the fund will be segregated by account numbers to the various park locations. Therefore, the ending fund balance may not revert to any other fund or be a surplus for any purpose.

The VC Rail Project is a Capital Project Fund. Revenues have been received in 2010-11 from the General Obligation Bonds for the restoration and construction of the Virginia and Truckee Railroad between Virginia City and Carson City. Other revenues will be generated through an Inter-local Cooperative Agreement with the Nevada Commission on Reconstruction of the Virginia & Truckee Railway; to return any of the funds collected by the Commission from the $\frac{1}{4}$ of 1 percent additional sales tax imposed.

We feel the overall and individual budgets are justified and will be adequately funded thru the revenue projections. Throughout the budget year, we will maintain additional cost control and measures such as management approval of all non reoccurring expenses in excess of \$1,500.00. Storey County Employees are now implementing a job sharing program in which other department with similar duties may provide organizational support in other department, to provide some relief due to the continuing our hiring/replacement freeze and similar programs.
